than to imply that the way to be more Christ-like is primarily through the negative approach of giving up bad habits. There are certainly many things we could and should give up to be better persons. However, the basic goals for the Christian life is not to add more no-no's to a list so the person with the longest list of no-no's becomes the best Christian.

So, Jesus knew that loving one's self as he ought and loving one's neighbor was all part of the same parcel. Kierkegaard has said, "If anyone, therefore, will not learn from Christianity to love himself in the right way, then neither can he love his neighbor. To love one's self in the right way and to love one's peighbor are absolutely analogous concepts, are at the bottom one and the same. Hence the law is: 'You shall love yourself as you love your neighbor when you love him as yourself."


