Among Blacks, Sigma Pi Phi is the oldest Greek letter society in America. It was founded in 1904 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania by a small group of professional men, for the purpose of providing "men like qualities" and opportunity for close fellowship in an atmosphere of mutual respect

and relaxing comaraderie. The fraternity has broadened its interest from being a purely social organization to include a vital social action program. Last May, the Beta Delta Boule spon-sored a workshop and awards ceremony at J.C. Smith but only invited outstanding male students. "We are looking forward to branching out and honoring both males and females because that is the overall purpose of the Fraternity," Stroud explains. "I can't say that we'll include females in our local program next year, but it will be considered.




