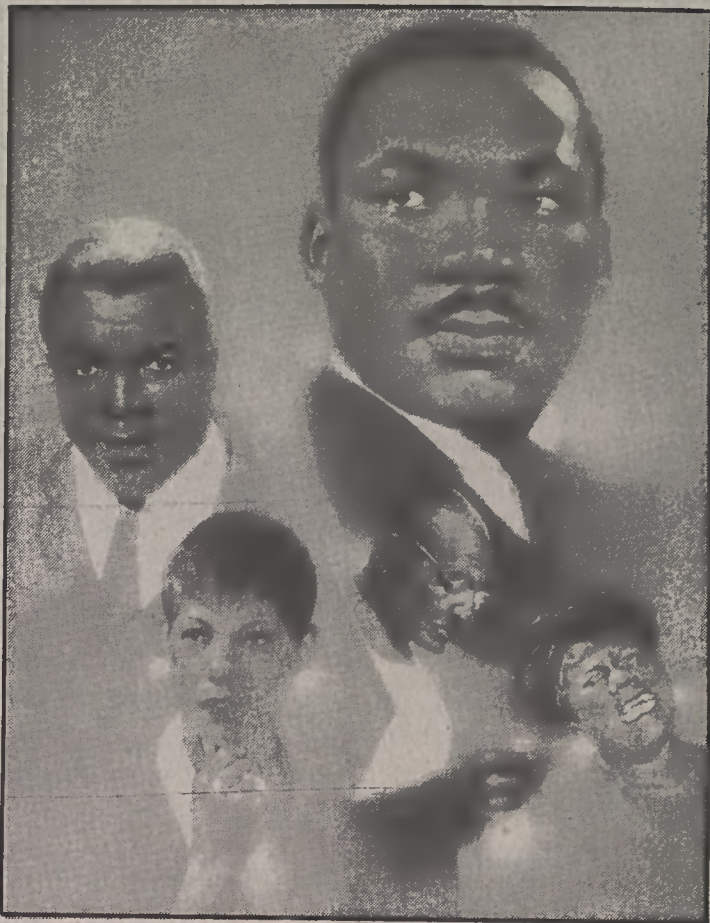

Colorful Poster By Black Artist



Dallas, Tx. - In an early salute to Black History Month, the Seven-Up Company recently unveiled its upcoming "Leaders and Legends" promotion, a four-color poster featuring compelling renditions of civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr., baseball Hall of Famer Jackie Robinson, gospel singer Mahalia Jackson, Olympian Wilma Rudolph and inventor-scientist George Washington Carver.

Painted by Dean Mitchell, a Kansas City-based black artist who, at 30 years old is receiving international acclaim, the "Leaders and Legends" poster also spotlights the emergence of talented young blacks into the commercial and fine arts painting arena.

Mitchell was commissioned by Budweiser to paint a portrait of Queen Hatshepsut for its "Great Kings and Queens of Africa" art series in 1985. He also created a 140-foot long mural on the history of jazz for the Vista International Hotel in Kansas City, Missouri and a Special Olympian poster for the 1987 McDonald's U.S. Gymnastics Championships.

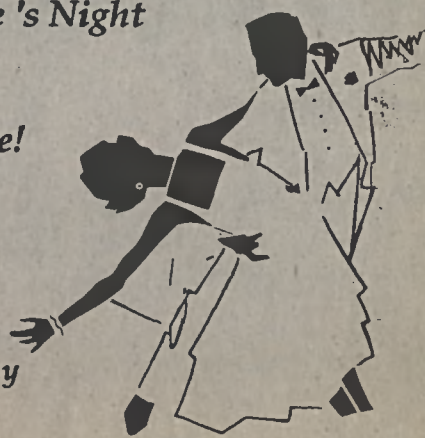

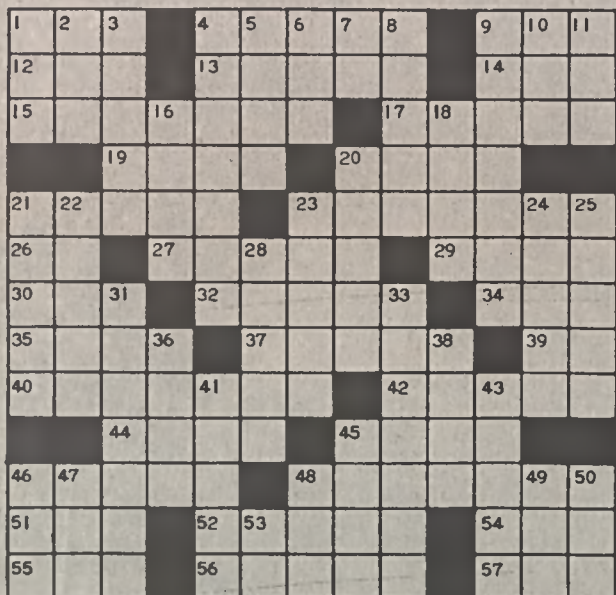
