## **Southern Bell Creates New Scholarship For Minorities**

Citing a commitment to educa tion and respect for individual achievement, a top Southern Bell executive recently announced a college scholarship program for women and minori-ties in North Carolina.

Joseph P. Lacher, vice presi-dent for North Carolina opera-tions, said the company will award five Southern Bell Math and Science Scholarships this year to students interested in pursuing degrees and careers in technical fields.

The scholarships are for \$2,000 annually and are renewable. Recipients will also have the opportunity for summer in-ternships or co-op employment with Southern Bell.
