Prizes will be given away and refreshments will be served.

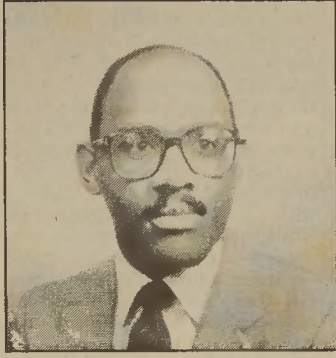

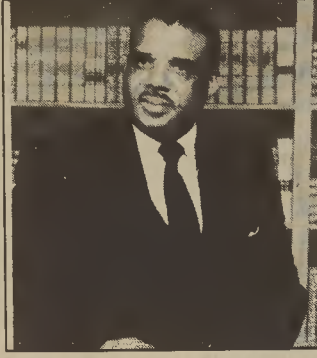

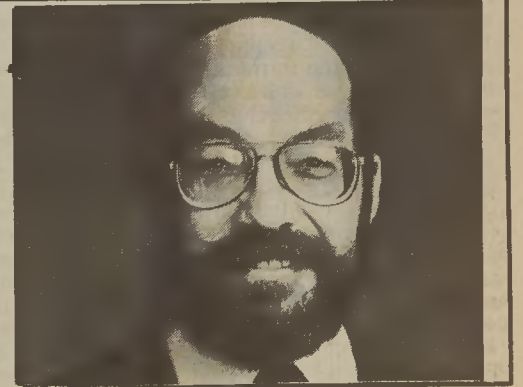
