Southern University and Southern University at New Orleans law school, all traditional black law schools.

Castille said one of the problems in getting blacks to join the DA's office is the fact that large law firms are offering salaries of \$50,000, while the DA's office can only counter with a starting salary of \$28,000.

Means also supervises Castille's new Community Outreach Program, which assigns assistant district attorneys to the Neighborhood Advisory Councils that meet monthly in the city's 23 police districts.

Means explained its purpose is to facilitate communications between community groups leaders and police and permit the DA's office and the Police Department to work together on "common community" problems.

He said it will acquaint the assistant DA's cultural and civic groups and the special problems in their district.
