Two Johnson C. Smith University students, Alisa Genelle Mitchell and Jimmie Hayes Smith Jr., will spend the summer studying abroad. Alisa has been admitted as a visiting student to study at The American University of Paris for a year while Jimmie will study at the Gruppe Max Plank Institute in West Germany.
