JCSU Students Will Receive Richardson Biology Scholarships

The Naudin-Dibble family will celebrate its 10th family reunion July 27th-30th. One of the most unique features of the four-day event will be the awarding of scholarship money to Johnson C. Smith University (JCSU).

The Naudin-Dibble family will present scholarship checks to three JCSU students in honor of their family, the late Dr. Annie Louise Richardson.

Richardson, a native Charlottean, attended Fisk University but transferred to JCSU where she graduated with honors in biology and chemistry. She received her doctorate in philosophy from the University of Illinois at Urbana.

Later in her career she returned to JCSU where she was a professor of biology and chairman of the biology department. She also taught biology at Norfolk State University for 19 years.

After her death in 1983, it was discovered through her will that she wanted a trustee board organized to give scholarships to three of the schools she had been affiliated with

affiliated with.

The trustee board consisted of her nephews: Wayne B. Hawkins, Titus Ivory, Attorney Reginald Hawkins (Abdul Salim) and the late Attorney Cecil A.

"The three colleges that are involved are Johnson C. Smith

University, Norfolk State University and the University of Illinois at Urbana," said Titus Ivory, head trustee.

"She wanted the interest received from her mutual fund to be awarded as scholarships. The principle amount always stays in tact and based on the amount of interest that was earned we were able to give these scholarships to JCSU," said lyory.

One of the main requirements for receiving the scholarships is that the student be a biology major.

"We made Marilyn Sutton-Haywood, chairman of the biology department at Smith, aware of the scholarship money and solicited her help in recommending three deserving students," said Ivory.

The recipients are as follows: Shania Jackson-\$500; Tina McEachin-\$300 and Bradfort Clinton-\$200.

The scholarships will be presented at the reunion banquet which will be held at the Charlotte Marriott City Center on Friday evening.

"There was a common bond," says Lt. Governor Lawrence Douglas Wilder of Virginia, speaking of his college experience. "We all knew who we were and where we needed to go, and what we needed to do to get there." Nominate An Outstanding Woman For Equality Day

Nominations are being sought for the third annual Women's Equality Day Award, sponsored by the Mecklenburg County Women's Commission. The deadline for submitting nominations is August 3.

The award is presented to the woman who has done the most to promote women's equality during the past year. Nominees must be North Carolina residents and registered voters. Each nominee should have a long-term commitment to women's issues with at least five years' involvement and have taken a leadership role in the last year.

The winner will be announced at the Women's Equality Day luncheon to be held at the Grady Cole Center on August 25 at noon. All nominees will be recognized at that time.
