## A Tribute To Seniors

Churches and synagogues throughout the nation were asked to cooperate with the National Caucus and Center on Black Aged, Inc. in observing NCBA DAY as a tribute to older Americans during September, 1989.

"This will be the day for your church to praise the contributions of your elderly parishioners and to recognize the many problems faced by this growing segment of our society," NCBA co-chairman Aaron E. Henry of Clarksdale, MS, and Gorham L. Black Jr., Harrisburg, PA, wrote in letters being distributed in key areas of the country.

The NCBA Board is asking the religious institutions "to honor and recognize the contributions and sacrifices of the black elderly. The many problems affecting them call for a major effort on the part of the church and the community to dramatize their plight. We must encourage the church ... our most effective community institution ... to assist in the effort to improve the living conditions of the black elderly," NCBA President Samuel J. Simmons said in announcing the campaign.

The religious leaders were urged to plan a recognition activity to honor the elderly and to encourage members to take out individual group (church) and life memberships in the NCBA to provide support services. "We are hopeful that all of us will rededicate ourselves to the preservation of our most precious resource - the elderly," said Simmons.

Founded in 1970, NCBA is the only national organization dedicated exclusively to improving the quality of life for the nation's three million black elderly citizens. Headquartered in Washington, DC, it has voluntary chapters and affiliated units in 38 states.

NCBA activities include the senior voter crusade, transportation, employment, housing and health programs for the elderly. It has established housing developments in several cities and operates training and job placement programs in 10 states. NCBA has conducted extensive research on the black elderly in the areas of health, employment and the utilization and delivery of human service systems.

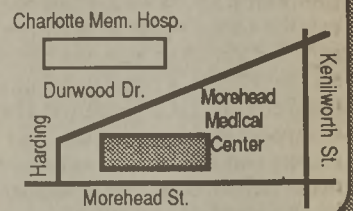

## EYE ON GOSPEL

**Take Six -- Most Sought After Group In Gospel.** With the tremendous success of Take Six's self-titled debut, which went gold, the group is one of the most sought after groups in gospel music. However, many like Rev. James Cleveland consider the group to be "more entertainment oriented than gospel oriented." That doesn't bother manager Gail Hamilton. "Our mission is to reach people who have not necessarily embraced Jesus. Not the Christian who has already identified and I don't think that's a sell-out. It's a way of packaging the ministry to people who would not ordinarily embrace this message... that Jesus is Lord and God is love. We were at the Playboy Jazz Festival and to listen to thousands of people singing, 'If we ever needed the Lord, we sure do need Him now.' It was great. I thought I knew the Lord before, but lately he has become really real, because I am really witnessing now. It's real easy for Christians to talk about Jesus to each other, but it's something else to talk to someone who has put it on the shelf or is not interested anymore. That's the challenge." The group just wound down a three-month tour with Al Jarreau. They are presently at work on a second album.

**Has Rev. Clay Evans lost interest in gospel music?** Hard to believe but for all his accolades, concert requests and awards (most recently male vocalist of the year at Rev. Cleveland's Gospel Music Workshop), it's getting harder and harder to get Rev. Clay Evans to sing these days. Said Evans, "I don't want people to see me as a singing preacher. I'm a preacher who happens to sing, pray counsel and teach. And my longest stick now is preaching and teaching. It's just that simple."
