The Sunday School Lesson by Bessie Wilbon

INTRODUCTION:

Many of God's people have possessed a great assurance of a specif-ic life purpose to which God has appointed them. These have been able to face the harshest of difficulties without flinching, because they knew the use of living. Such a one was the prophet Jeremiah to whom God said, "Before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctlfied thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nation.

Centuries later came John the Baptist, whose single life mission, foretold in prophecy and by direct revelation, was to announce and bear witness to the coming Messiah. His life style was wholly opposite to that of the luxury-loving king described in Ecclesiastes, but it was much more satisfying. He did what God sent him to do.

John's Gospel opens with a prologue (1:1-18) introducing Jesus as the eternal Word, active in creation, but coming to earth in human form as Jesus. It is interrupted briefly by reference to John the Baptist, as the man sent from God to announce the Lords' coming.

"God sent his messenger, a man named John, who came to tell people about the light, so that all should hear the message, and believe. He himself was not the light; he came to tell about the light. This was the real light - the light that comes into the world and shines on all mankind. (John 1:6-9) The Jewish authorities in Jerusalem sent some priests and Levites to John to ask him "Who are you?" John did not refuse to answer, but spoke out openly and clearly, saying: "I am not the Messiah." Who are you then? "they asked." "Are you Elijah"" "No, I am not" John answered. "Are you the Prophet?" They asked. "No," he replied. "Then tell us who you are," they said. "We have to take an answer back to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" John answered by quoting the prophet Isalah: "I am the voice of someone shouting in the desert: Make a straight path for the Lord to travel!" (John 1:19-23) The next day John saw Jesus coming to him, and said, "There is the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is the one I was talking about when I said, "A min is coming after me, but he is greater than I am, because he existed before I was born." I did not know who he would be, but I came baptizing with water in order to make him known to the people of Israel. And John gave this testimony: "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and stay on him. I still did not know that he was the one, but God, who sent me to baptize with water, had said to me, "You will see the Spirit come down and stay on a man; he is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit. "I have seen it," said John, "and I tell you that he is the Son of God." (John 1:29-34)

John had been sent as an emissary with a special mission. He was sent from God, who provided a special miracle that John should be born to aged and otherwise barren parents. His coming was an-nounced by the angel Gabriel, who said that he would "be filled with the Holy Ghost, even from his mother's womb." So John was to intro-duce the Savior, not only by announcement but also by preparing the people to receive Him.

The Jewish people expected their Messiah to come in power as the Lion of the tribe of Judah. John introduced a different side of the Messiah's character. His reference to the Lamb of God was timely, since the Passover was soon to be observed. At the observance, each family would stay and eat a lamb, remembering their ancestors deliverance from the plague of death in Egypt, followed by their escape from bondage.

Something more than the Passover was set forth in John's introduction of Jesus as the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world. The blood of the Passover lamb protected from immediate physical death; God's lamb would remove sin entirely as Isaiah had prophesied.

Moreover, the Passover had been effective for none but the children of Israel in Egypt; God's Lamb would bear and remove sin from the whole world - Egypt as well as Israel, and all believers on all continents for as many centuries as the world shall stand. Let all mankind everywhere behold the Lamb - get well acquainted with Him who is Savior and Lord, and king of all kingdoms forever.

John was always aware of Jesus as a person. Their mothers were related, and had spent time together during their pregnancies talking about the sons who were to be born of them. John was six months older than Jesus and he had been preaching and baptizing for some time before Jesus came to him for baptism. Until that moment John did not know that Jesus was the Messiah, but he was well enough acquainted with Him to know that it was more fitting for him to be baptized by Jesus than the opposite. On that occasion, however, it was revealed to John that Jesus was indeed the one for whom he had come to prepare the way. That meant that Jesus was <u>before</u> John, both in His being with God and eternity and in His superior standing with God and men.

But you will not blame them for your lost condition because God called you and you refused. No man will stand at the judgment and say God didn't call him. Now what are you going to do? You are going out into eternity. You have a never-dying soul that will live as long as God lives. If you fail to come to know Christ, you'll have no foundation to stand on that day. The day of THE GREAT WHITE THRONE JUDGMENT will be the saddest day in all the world. How will you fare there? Consider these things we are setting before you. consider the Lord Jesus Christ, whom you must come to know here in time or forever be lost.
