Richard Schneiderman, director of the North Carolina Museum of Art, will be the guest speaker at the ball, and Lisa Cooley of WBTV will be the mistress of ceremonies. Special recognition will be given to Haywood Oubre of Winston-Salem for his lifetime contribution as a visual artist and teacher, and works by other African American artists will be on display. Proceeds from the ball will help provide funds for exhibitions and acquisitions by African American artists as well as cultural programming throughout Mecklenburg; County.


