Cherry Community Pulls Together For Its Own **Neighborhood Watch**

Approximately 60 residents of the Cherry Community attended a Neighborhood Watch program information session at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church

Charlotte Police Captain Maurice Keith and Officer Nick Pellicone of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department provided information to residents about the guidelines for implementing the program. Residents were told about the importance of deterring crime by utilizing techniques such as engraving valuable items within their homes and placing Neighborhood Watch signs at various entry points throughout the community.

Cherry is one of the oldest African American communities in Charlotte. though it is somewhat more diverse now, residents, both old and young, black and white, committed themselves to doing all that needs to be done to preserve the integrity of the more than 100 year old community

Residents asked Pellicone about possible solutions to problems such as slow response time from law enforcement officers, and disinsensitivity patcher

towards a person who is reporting a crime in progress. They also discussed the options of having a community-based police unit esta-blished in Cherry, as well as holding absentee landlords accountable for the activities which take place on their property. In addition, residents want strict enforcement of a curfew for the public park located in the




