

Crossing The Line: Did Ted Danson go too far? That's what a lot of people are asking in the wake of the uproar over his recent New York Friars Club roasting of Whoopi Goldberg. Danson, who was toastmaster, did a near 20-minute monologue that from all accounts was closer to offensive than raunchy, complete with references to his and Whoopi's sex life. He stunned a star-studded crowd including Michael Douglas, Sugar Ray Leonard, Ed Begley Jr., Geraldo Rivera, Chris Rock, Halle Berry, Natalie Cole, Robert DeNiro, Larry King, Robert Guillaume, Malcolm Jamal Warner and Robin Williams with his entrance in blackface, use of the term "nigger" and a



slew of racially-offensive jokes exploiting sexual stereotypes. Talk show host Montel Williams walked out. Said Williams, "when Ted made the jokes about racially-mixed kids and everyone knows my wife is white and just gave birth to our child. I could see my wife start to cry." (Williams has since resigned from the Friars). "Perhaps Montel's show wasn't doing as well as it should be and this was his way to draw attention," said Whoopi of Williams, who went public with his outrage. But Montel wasn't the only one offended. Several other

COLLINS blacks walked out. Many of those who remained didn't quite know how to take it. "I've been to other Friar roasts," said Mayor Dinkins. "This one went over the line." Those leaving early included




thought the word "nigger" would come up. Danson, too, is thrown. A statement issued by the actor said his intent "was to amuse my dear friend Whoopi in what I thought was the privacy of the Friars Club." In an offi-cial statement, the Friars Club apologized and said they were "caddened by the racially offensive nature of some of the material." But for all the flap, has no one yet stopped to examine that Danson's intent was hardly to offend black women? In fact, it was blatantly apparent that he had a great deal of love for at least one. So how does Whoopi feel? She called Danson her best friend in the world. "But," she told one re-porter, "if you're asking are we going to run off and get married, the answer is no. 
