"Athleticism must come first, and then certain technical skills, and creative movement, and then interpretive skill. With all that you may become an artist," Knapp said. "It's hard for a parent to know what kind of training is good, but it is more than learning steps.

"If the training stops short of the creative level, children should just dance until they get to the university level."

Dance schools relatively close to Arkansas include North Carolina School of the Arts, the University of Kansas and the University of New Mexico. Many university programs take dance to "risk" levels, Knapp said, but risk in dance


does not mean physical danger.

"It's easy for dancers who have all the athletic skills and steps they need to perform in a realm of safety," Knapp said. "The great teachers knew when I was faking and they let me know it. They will demand a baring of the soul, a risk, (so) that the dancer feels the thing the viewer feels."

Ultimately, though, everyone young and old should dance for the joy of it, she said.

Even if Knapp hadn't had the will to dance and good teachers to help her become a professional dancer, she said, she would have danced "for what it does for the soul. That's why I
