tered to them." Lancaster said, "A lot of people in here don't really know God."

He said they have heard of God, but they don't have a real understanding of Him.

Lancaster said having people minister at the facility has really brought a lot of joy into his life but he isn't in a rush to declare which religion he'll prac-

"At this point I consider myself non-denominational because I understand that there are different types of religions, but I do believe that Jesus is the one who came and died on the cross for our sins," he said. "I am spending time trying to get the full understanding about God for myself. I am not the type of person who would go with one type of religion without knowing exactly where I am

Lancaster said he is feeling his way through religion and reading about it for himself.

"I am not going to say that I am with a Muslim religion, a Christian religion, or a Jehovah Witness religion because they all have good teachings, but I'll stay non-denominational until God leads me to do otherwise."

Lancaster says that it is important to have a ministry at the rehabilitation facility. He says he is trying to learn all that he can while incarcerated. "When I was out in the streets, I was doing a lot of running around and being too fast for

myself, but I have three young children now and I know if I learn as much as I can about the Bible and about God, I can get out there and show them a better way," Lancaster said. "I know that by exposing them to God, He will manifest in them and make them good kids like I always wanted to be."

Lancaster appreciates the people coming to speak. "I think that it is great that people want to do things for others," he said. "God chooses people to show others the way."

Robert Slade, 33, said: "Having people to come and minister to me has helped me to become more open -minded about religion."

Slade said since he has been at Right Turn, he reads the Bible a lot, and is getting a better understanding of God, and he has hope for his future.

"At one time I had given up on life, but since becoming closer to God, I have learned a lot of what life is all about," he said.

Slade, who is scheduled to be baptized this month said, "I believe I am on the right track.'

"Having ministry in prison is very important to me because I believe that idle time is the devil's workshop," said 38-yearold Donald Henderson, a Right Turn inmate. "The ministry and the program also teaches discipline. I think that God put me here to save me. The people who come here to speak to us have helped to show me that

this is ironic when once upon time, we had the largest library in the world in Africa. "We just don't want our chil-

dren to view black history only from the time of slavery. It is important that they learn about their history from the beginning of time," she said. Chambers said: "Our pastor,

Rev. Sheldon R. Shipman, has been very supportive of this event. He truly enjoys African history himself and he serves on the board of directors of this program.

Chambers said spirituality plays a major role in this program because, "Everything we do begins and ends with prayer.

She said any child can attend the program and it is not just for the people of the church. "There were fifty slots open for this program. If a child was not able to attend this workshop, they can attend the next one."
