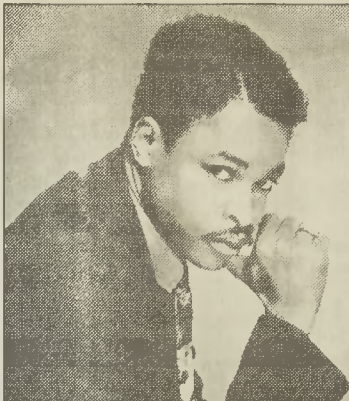

AMAZING GRACE: THE BLACK CHURCH IN AFRICAN-AMERICAN SOCIETY

November 1, 1996 to January 5, 1997

As Spirit Square dives into the historical reality of slavery with the national exhibit **A Slave Ship Speaks: The Wreck of the Henrietta Marie**, The Museum of the New South will provide another facet of the African-American experience. **Amazing Grace: The Black Church in African-American Society** explores the role of the black church since slavery. Come share the unique experience.

The Amazing Grace exhibit draws from recollections gathered from oral history interviews to help us understand the religious traditions and characters of our region. Explore the church's historical presence as voices from our community describe the black church as a refuge from racism, a source of spirituality and pride, and a catalyst for social and political change.
