# Cameras on board police cruisers

When an officer decides to leave the automobile on traffic stops, the camera can zoom down and record the license plate number, then return to the usual wide shot.

Once the officer is out of the vehicle, they can turn on a microphone attached to their shirt by touching a button on their waist. There is an orange light on the right-hand corner of the patrol vehicle that will

light up, letting the officer know that all components are running.

Officer Sam Russell feels that the new machinery will help the police department in many of their further efforts of law enforcement.

"Most people don't have any idea that we have it," he said. "They (cameras) are making officers more aware of safety and their tactics have gotten

better with the equipment."

Russell also believes that the cameras can come in handy with vehicle chases and as references as to how situations could have been handled differently.

The cameras are expensive, approximately \$15,200 per unit. In order to outfit all of the department's 45 cars would cost almost \$200,000, Belk said.

kids before they get into the court system," said Flowers, who chairs the Inter-Agency Task Force on At-Risk Juveniles. "We spent all of 1996 developing guidelines, procedures and policies."

Through the efforts of the Winston-Salem Foundation, the Salisbury Community

Foundation and the winnings of Allyn Adams in the Crosby Golf Tournament, financial assistance was provided to the tune of nearly \$32,000 to get Adopt-A-Youth off the ground. Street says that the YMCA will provide the necessary training to equip volunteers to do their jobs effectively.

"We will instruct them in

constituting attractive ways of emphasizing the importance of staying in school as the prerequisite to getting good jobs and finding stable, lucrative careers in the future," he said.

The YMCA will ask their volunteers to spend at least one hour a week with the child that they are assigned to, Street said.
