a blue hatchback seen by a security guard near the crime scene.

The man, who was not identified by police, was "candid and cooperative," McBride said. He told police he had gone to the hilltop Mulholland Drive area to look at the city's lights.

Cosby's 27-year-old son had pulled off Interstate 405 near Mulholland Drive to change a flat tire early Thursday when he was shot to death. Police believe robbery was the motive.

A \$12,500 reward for the arrest and conviction of the killer was approved Tuesday by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. The National Enquirer and Globe tabloids earlier posted a total of \$300,000 in rewards.

Across America, the woman allegedly claiming to be the illegitimate daughter of Bill Cosby was ordered held without bail in New York.

Jackson, 22, of Los Angeles, and Jose Medina, 51, of Bethesda, Ohio, were arrested Saturday in the New York office of a Cosby lawyer, where they allegedly went to discuss a payoff.

On Thursday, the day Ennis Cosby was slain, Jackson allegedly sent a fax to Bill Cosby's representative saying it was "urgent that you contact me to make certain arrangements," the complaint says. "I need monies and I need monies now."

CBS said it also received a fax on Thursday. The network said that one stated that Cosby's show one of the network's best properties and disclosure that Ms. Jackson was

the entertainer's illegitimate daughter would undoubtedly affect its ratings.

Tony Frost, editor of The Globe tabloid, said Jackson and Medina also approached him the day before Ennis Cosby was killed. The newspaper began to look into their story, Frost told the New York Daily News, but went to the FBI after Cosby was killed.

Medina's lawyer, Neil Checkman, said his client says he is a screenwriter and denies the charges. "I don't believe he necessarily knew that anything was going on," Checkman said.

Jackson's lawyer, Robert Baulm, could not be reached for comment after business hours Tuesday. A call to the Legal Aid Society office where he works was not immediately returned.

# Wallace's relatives, TNT at odds

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Old and ailing, George C. Wallace is taking on Hollywood in a fight that could determine how a new generation views his segregationist past.

A Turner Network Television movie now in production is being opposed by Wallace and his relatives. They fear the film will be unfair to the four-term governor, who long ago apologized for his politics of racial separation.

Meanwhile, Wallace representatives are negotiating

with Spike Lee over use of an interview the black film maker conducted last year with the four-time presidential candidate for use in an HBO documentary.

Son George Wallace Jr. said Tuesday he fears both projects could result in his father's reputation being smeared 10

years after he left politics and despite repeated efforts to make amends.

"I grow a bit weary with people who were always his critics saying he has to spend the rest of his life apologizing," said the younger Wallace. "He's apolo-

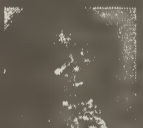
