A Turner Network Television movie now in production is being opposed by Wallace and his relatives. They fear the film will be unfair to the fourterm governor, who long ago apologized for his politics of racial separation.

Meanwhile, Wallace representatives are negotiating

with Spike Lee over use of an interview the black film maker conducted last year with the four-time presidential candidate for use in an HBO documentary.

Son George Wallace Jr. said Tuesday he fears both projects could result in his father's reputation being smeared 10 years after he left politics and despite repeated efforts to make amends.

"I grow a bit weary with people who were always his critics saying he has to spend the rest of his life apologizing," said the younger Wallace. "He's apolo-
