'Star Wars'still a force; has \$36 million weekend

LOS ANGELES - The power of the force propelled "Star Wars" to the top of the box office, leaving all other competition in the dark side of the galaxy.

The second opening of the refurbished film was the topselling January weekend release ever, figures released Sunday showed.

"Star Wars" collected an estimated \$36.2 million over the weekend, dwarfing the nation's No. 2 film, "Jerry Maguire," which took in \$5.6

The movie, with enhanced special effects and a few new scenes, had the ninth-highest opening ever, three-day according to estimates from Exhibitor Relations Co. Inc.

The epic about a motley band of heroes fighting an evil space empire "a long time ago in a galaxy far, far away" has screened only in video form for a generation.

Americans still captivated by "the ultimate story of good and evil" flocked to theaters to see it again on the big screen, and many brought their children, said Tom Sherak, chairman of 20th Century Fox Domestic Film Group.

"It's part of our culture," he said. "It's one of those rare <mark>instances w</mark>here a movie becomes our best friend. We remember the best friend."

Adam Gordon, 26, and brother Eric, 23, both of Los Angeles, said they had seen the film a total of 83 times. On Sunday, they stood in line to see it again in Sherman Oaks.

An afternoon showing at the enchanted theater Destin, 13, of Beverly Hills. She had never seen the movie, even on video.

"It was excellent." she said. 'I loved Harrison Ford. I hope he gets Princess Leia."

"The graphics are better and so is the sound," said 11-yearold Brendan Gibson of Van Nuys, an old video hand. "Some of the places and people in there seem real.'

His review: "It's good for kids. It doesn't have any bad language in it and there's really no violence.

In its 1977 release, "Star Wars" grossed \$323 million in North America - then a record and still fourth on the all-time list. The re-release is sure to push "Star Wars" higher on that list, Sherak said.

The second and third chapters of the trilogy, "The Empire Strikes Back" (1980) and Strikes Back" (1980) and "Return of the Jedi" (1983) also will be re-released in coming

The only truly new release in the top 10, "Gridlock'd," star-ring Tim Roth and the late Tupac Shakur, opened at No. 9 by collecting \$2.8 million.

Two other debuts with bigname stars opened outside the

top 10. "Meet Wally Sparks," a comedy with Rodney Dangerfield as a sleazy TV talk-show host, took in \$2.2 million.

"The Shadow Conspiracy," a political thriller starring Charlie Sheen as a White House aide who learns of a plot against the president, drew \$1.4 million in ticket






