

Dillard president to take reigns of College Fund

WASHINGTON — The United Negro College Fund has a new leader.

Michael L. Lomax will succeed William H. Gray, III as president and CEO of UNCF. Lomax, president of Dillard University in New Orleans, will officially join UNCF on June 1.

"We are extremely excited about the selection of Dr. Michael Lomax," said Michael H. Jordan, chairman & CEO of EDS, and chairman of UNCF's Board of Directors.

"Dr. Lomax brings a wealth of talent and experience to this organization and we are confident that his impressive background in education, management and fundraising, will help UNCF continue to grow and expand its mission."

"UNCF plays a critical role in creating educational opportunities for deserving young men and women and in supporting historically black colleges and universities," Lomax said. "I am honored to have this opportunity and look forward to this exciting new challenge."

Lomax has served as president of UNCF member college Dillard University since 1997, where he implemented a variety of successful initiatives to strengthen the institution. During his tenure, student enrollment increased by 49 percent, private funding by 300 percent, and alumni giving more than 2,000 percent.

In addition, he led an aggressive \$60 million campus renovation program to improve the living and learning environment for Dillard

students. Lomax has been on the faculties of Morehouse College and Spelman College and has taught at Emory University, University of Georgia, and the Georgia Institute of Technology.

"I think he has an intimate understanding of the challenges HBCUs face and the role UNCF plays in supporting these vital institutions," said Sebetha Jenkins, president of UNCF member institution Jarvis Christian College and chair of UNCF member presidents.

"Not only has he successfully led a UNCF college, but he has also taught at two UNCF colleges and is a graduate of a UNCF member institution."

Throughout his career, Lomax has demonstrated strong management skills and knowledge of fundraising. For 12 years, he served as chairman of the board of

commissioners of Fulton County in Georgia, the top elected official in that state's largest and most populous county. He was responsible for a \$500 million operating budget and 5,000 county employees.

An experienced non-profit administrator and fundraiser, Lomax serves on the Board of Trustees of the United Way of America, where he assists in developing national strategies for increasing donations from corporations, foundations, and individuals.

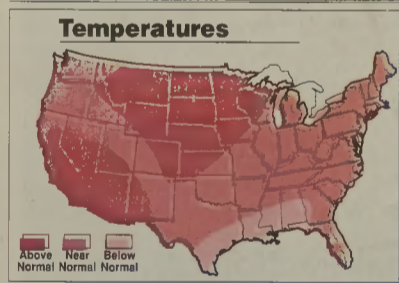

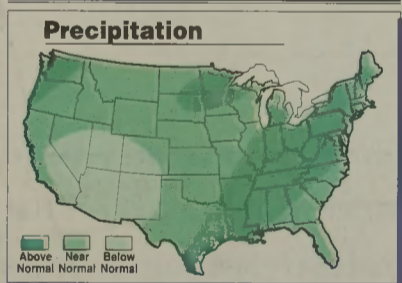
