encountered skepticism about the recommendations - and she even has some skepticism of her own.

"Absolutely, I think the community meetings will be really good - everybody needs to feel like they're a part of the discussion," Griffin said. "But I'm not sure I believe everything in that report will be adopted. I just have a hard time seeing that happening."

Griffin expressed concern about the task force's recommendation to have one central office but divide into three or four parts with each having its own superintendent, which would, among other things, individually choose

how to educate its students. "Personally, my first reaction is they went a little too far when they started talking about curriculum issues. Griffin said. "That's not their area of expertise. I think that's better left to the educators themselves."

doubts about the benefits of adding one appointed member to the school board, as the task force suggested.

Child care is an especially difficult hurdle for low-income families, the study found. One

in six poor families have had to quit, refuse or change a job because of child care issues in the past year. More than 30,000 N.C. children can't get child care subsidies their parents need to afford child care while they work.

The gap in health care between poor and upperincome children is closing, however. Higher-income families are three times more likely to have private health insurance, access to publiclyfinanced programs like Medicaid and Health Choice has trimmed the gap to 12 percent of North Carolinians who have any type of insurance. Still, 1 in 5 low-income kids went without health insurance at some point the year before the survey.

Actor: History month is 'ridiculous'

Morgan Freeman says the concept of a month dedicated to Black history is "ridiculous

You're going to relegate my history to a month?" 68-year-old actor says in an interview on CBS' "60 Minutes" Sunday. "I don't want a black month. Black history is American history.

Black History Month has roots in historian Carter G. Woodson's Negro History Week, which he designated in 1926 as the second week in February to mark the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln.

Woodson said he hoped the week could one day be eliminated - when Black history would become fundamental to American history.

Freeman notes there is no "White history month," and says the only way to get rid of racism is to "stop talking about it." The actor says he believes the labels 'black' and "white" are an obstacle

"I am going to stop calling you a white man and I'm going to ask you to stop calling me a black man," Freeman says.

Freeman earned three Oscar nominations before winning earlier this year for "Million Dollar Baby"
