

SIAC adds teams, goes to grid divisions

The Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and its member institutions announced last week that it will move to an East/West Division format for football beginning in the 2006 football season.

With the addition of Claffin University, Langston University and Lincoln University to the conference the SIAC will now move to a six (6)team East/West format for football (Claflin currently does not sponsor football)

The format for the East/West Division included considerations to keep the 11-game format for scheduling, maximum of two protective dates to account for traditional rivalries and Classics, and a consideration for a long-term format of at least four (4) Under the new years East/West format each team's conference schedule will be reduced to eight games which includes five (5) interdivisional games and three (3) crossover conference divisional games.



This allows each team three optional open dates for non-conference games versus opponents outside the conference, or others within the conference

to make up the 11-game schedule. A round robin format was used to configure the crossover-game format with a home-and-home rotation occurring before the crossover schedules change. Under this plan Eastern Division schools will have only minimal travel contact with Lincoln and Langston in the West meaning no team from the East will have to travel to both Lincoln and Langston during

a conference championship game however the champion of the conference will be determined by the highest winning percentage of conference games, head to head competition. record against common conference opponents with full Division II membership, scoring margin in games played among the teams locked in a tie and overall record. The Conference Champion will represent the SIAC in the annual Pioneer Bowl unless that team is selected for the NCAA Division II Play offs, in which the conference runner-up will be cho-

Commissioner stated "this is a big step that the Conference is making. The East/West format will allow for our member institutions to play within a region and also allows for our two new football members, Lincoln and Langston University, to have a smooth transition into the conference while allowing key match ups, traditional rivalries and classics to still take place. This East/West Format will also generate new rivalries and intense competition between the two sides thus generating exciting SIAC football action across the country on a week to week basis.

The East/West Format will also be considered for adoption for the 2006-2007 basketball season and is already in action in many of the Spring Sports of the SIAC Schedules reflecting the SIAC football East/West Format are under finalization and will be updated on the SIAC website upon completion.'

ime 3-pointers mark, at 168, one more than former eammate Cherise Sims (1999-2003)

Hampton's Taylor tabs Beatty

Hampton University head football coach Joe aylor has turned to successful Hampton-area high chool coach Chris Beatty to be the Pirates' new offensive coordinator.

Beatty, 32, who employed a wide-open passng attack while leading Landstown High of Newport News, Va., to the 2004 Virginia High School eague Division 6 state championship and appearnces in the last thee state championship games, vill replace Fred Kaiss, who resigned from the position on Dec. 31.

Under Beatty's guidance, Landstown, in Virinia Beach, Va., posted 40 wins in 42 games and yon 10 of 12 playoff games during his three years hool Taylor bired Reatty on Ian 6 report the so dly to get more out of a passing attack which has struggled despite the Pirates winning back-to-back UDC to the 1982 Div. II national title and to the Mid Eastern Athletic Conference championships. The Pirates have lost the past two years in the first ound of the NCAA Div. I-AA playoffs. Four quarterbacks threw for more that 3,300

high school coach. Two of the receivers on this year's Landstown team, Percy Harvin and Damon McDaniel, who have both landed scholarships to play for Urban Meyer at Florida, were rated among the top ten in the nation at the position. McDaniel's brother Marquay is a wide receiver/kick returner on the Hampton squad.

Beatty had not made a secret of his desire to coach on the college level. "Hopefully we'll be able to throw more and use the spread offense," Beatty told the Hampton Daily Press. "I think I have something to add and can help the program get to the next level. I'm not intimidated by the challenge of coaching on this level." Beatty will assume his duties on Jan. 15.

Black college greats on Div. II Anniversary Ballot

Five former black college basketball standouts and two of the legendary black college hoops coaches are among the candidates for the NCAA Div. II Elite Eight 50th Anniversary Team.

The players are Earl "The Pearl" Monroe of Winston-Salem State, Earl Jones of the University of the District of Columbia, Michael Britt, also of UDC, Leonard "Truck" Robinson of Tennesee State and Marvin "The Human Eraser" Webster of Morgan State.

The coaching candidates are the late Clarence "Big House" Gaines of Winston-Salem State and current Virginia Union head coach Dave Robbins.

Monroe, who went on to a Hall of Fame NBA career with the Baltimore Bullets and New York Knicks, dazzled the nation averaging 43.2 points per game while leading WSSU to the 1967 Div. II national title under Gaines, the first NCAA basketball crown won by an HBCU. Monroe averaged 31 points and 12 rebounds in his WSSU career

Robinson averaged 17.2 ppg., and 10.8 rpg., over two years at Tennessee State while leading the Tigers to a third-place finish in 1972 and a second-place finish in 1973. Webster, a 6-11 center and shot blocker extraordinaire, led the Bears to the Div. II national championship in 1974 averaging 22.6 points and 21.6 rebounds per game. Both Robinson and Webster had long NBA careers. Robbins has won Div. II championships at Virginia Union in 1980, 1992 and 2005 while compiling a 12-3 mark (.800) in six appearances at the Elite
