Robert McCullough, Rock Hill civil rights leader, dies at age 64

ROCK HILL, S.C. — Robert McCullough, the leader of a group of Rock Hill students who served 30 days in jail for sitting at a whites-only lunch counter during the civil rights movement, died Monday.

A cause of death was not given, Robinson Funeral Home spokesman Samuel Reid said. McCullough was 64.

McCullough, along with eight other black students from Friendship Junior College, used the "jail, no bail" technique in 1961 after they were arrested. Given the option of paying a \$100 fine or jail time, the students — called

the Friendship Nine — chose to serve hard labor on a chain gang rather than pay the fine, gaining widespread media attention.

McCullough, who was selected as the group's leader, chose to sit at a whites-only lunch counter in downtown Rock Hill. The men demanded service, were arrested and charged with trespassing and breach of peace.

McCullough "did all the detail work and made sure everything was in place," said David Williamson, a group member. "He was like our teacher."

Another member of the group says initially he

thought McCullough was crazy, but eventually the leader made him realize change was needed.

"I could have eaten anywhere I wanted it," Thomas "Dub" Massey said. "I didn't have to sit on that white stool in that white dime store."

But Massey, then 18, says McCullough helped him recognize what was happening at the lunch counters was wrong.

"After talking to Robert, I felt like I needed to be involved and be part of the change. He said, 'It's not just about you, Dub. This is for all of humanity.'"

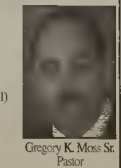
