## Catholic bishops urging vote on gay marriage

THE ASSOCIATED PRESS BOSTON — Religious groups on both sides of the same-sex marriage debate are gearing up for the Legis-lature's scheduled vote next wonth whether to put a pro-posed constitutional amend-ment banning gay marriage on the 2008 ballot. The state's four Roman Gatholic bishops, saying they are concerned that a walkout by lawmakers could prevent be vote on Nov 9, are urging Catholics to go to the State-bouse that day to voice their support for the proposed ban, The Boston Globe reported. 
