### N.C. Baptist delegates approve anti-gay policy

GREENSBORO —The Baptist State Convention of North Carolina voted Tuesday to bar congregations that affirm or approve of homosexuality from membership, enacting one of the most rigid anti-gay policies among the nation's Christian

churches.

The vote changes the convention's long-standing laws, which previously only had one simple requirement for membership: support the convention with both cooperation and financial contributions. Now any church that "knowingly act to affirm, approve, endorse, promote, support or bless homosexual behavior" can't belong to the group.

"This action does not mean that you should avoid ministry to the homosexual community," said convention executive director Milton Hollifield Jr. "Even though we believe that homosexuality is wrong, we still love and engage those in this lifestyle"

With over 4,000 member churches and 1.2 million members, the North Carolina Baptist convention is the second-largest

association of Baptist churches in the nation.

The policy is similar to one approved by the nation's largest Protestant denomination, the Nashville, Tenn.-based Southern Baptist Southern Baptist schanged their constitution in the early 1990s to say that "churches which act to affirm, approve, or endorse homosexual behavior" are "not in cooperation" with the convention.

In the past two decades, the SBC has approved several resolutions condemning homosexuality, most recently in 2003 when it voted to oppose gay marriage. Such resolutions are nonbinding and all member churches are autonomous in their ministries, but the Southern Baptists have severed ties with several congregations over the issue of homosexuality since the late 1980s.

Seventeen churches in North Carolina will come under imme diate scrutiny under the policy, convention spokesman Norman Jameson said. Those churches are associated with the Alliance of Baptists, a Washington D.C.-based group that welcomes gays

as equal members.

Th our day and time, no other sin marches so defiantly across our national landscape," said Mark Harris, a pastor with First Baptist Church in Charlotte.

Those churches contribute just \$185,000 to the Convention's \$36 million budget, Jameson said.

The proposed change to the Convention's Articles of Incorporation needed a two-thirds majority to pass. Voting was done by voice and not counted, but convention officials declared that the measure had passed.

A number of convention delegates—even those from churches who oppose homosexuality—criticized the change.

"Let's spend more time confessing our own sins than exposing the sins of others," said Don Gordon, senior pastor of Yates Baptist Church in Durham, who still labeled homosexuality as sinful behavior. "Let's let the whole world know that God loves every person."
