The word that is translated "strife" (v. 3) is eritheia, and it refers to a selfish kind of ambi-tion that does not include the idea of service for others as part of the moti-vation behind action. It is the kind of self-ishness that causes factions and rivalry instead of peace and cooperation.

means "empty glory" and refers to a conceited opinion of self. It is a vain attitude that causes a person to look down on others because they are viewed as being inferior This kind of attitude cannot fulfill the like-mindedness Paul mentioned in verse 2, for it promotes only the self with little or no considera-tion for others. "Many people-even Chris-tians-live only to make a

good impression on others or to please themselves. But self-centered living, selfish ambition, or conceit brings discord. Paul therefore stressed spiritual unity, ask-ing the Philippians to love one another and to be one in wirit act purpose. When you one another and to be one in spirit and purpose. When we work together, caring for the problems of others as if they were our problems (w. 4), we demonstrate Christ's exam-ple of putting others first, and we experience unity" (Osborne, ed., Life Applica-tion Bible Commentary, Tyndal

Gale). The antidote to selfish liv-ing is a humble attitude of willingness to consider others better than ourselves. When that is the case, we will not only have concern for our own interests (which is not inherinterests (which is not inher-ently a bad thing), but we will also have a sincere concern about the interests of those around us.

4. How are we to exhibit the mind of Christ in the way we

mind of Christ in the way we live (v. 5)? All of our attitudes should be patterned after the atti-tudes of Jesus. This is why it is important to study His life; that is the only way to under-stand what He did.

This is a consistent mes-sage in Paul's writings Ear-lier Paul warned the Chris-tians in Rome to avoid being "conformed" to the selfish ways of the world. Instead, they were to be "trans-formed" by having new minds, minds that were in line with the mind of
