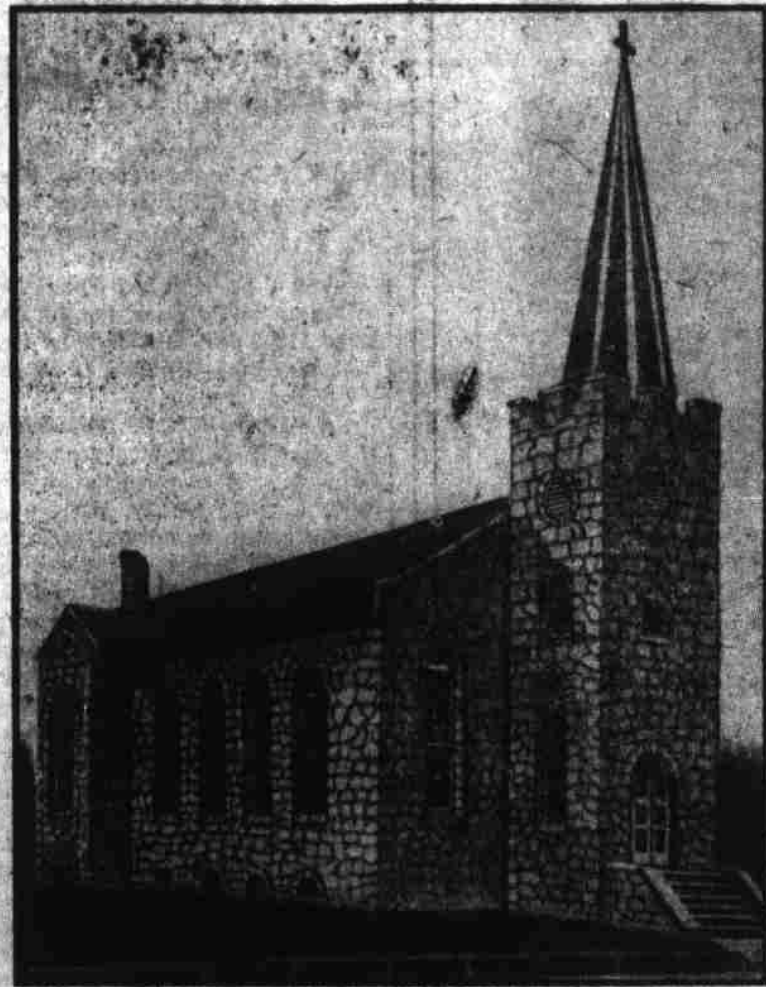
### THE SAME OLD STORY.

#### Three-year-old Durham Boy Victim of Open Fire.

Durham, Dec. 27.—The only fatality of Christmas reported in this city was the burning late yesterday afternoon of the three-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Marshall of East Durham. Just how the little fellow's clothing caught on fire is not known, as he was alone in the house when his screams attracted attention. Mrs. Marshall had gone into the back yard for a moment leaving the

terday afternoon. She had not been out of the house but a minute or two when the boy ran to the door screaming, with his clothing in a blaze. The mother and neighbors who were attracted by the cries rushed to him and put out the fire, but not before he had received fatal burns, death relieving the suffering about 9 o'clock last night.

The superstition is that the boy began playing in the fire when his mother left the room and the clothing caught in that manner.

## NEW CHURCH FOR SPENCER LUTHERANS

Calvary Lutheran Mission Will Erect Handsome Edifice at Once—New Church Will be of Rowan Granite and Will Cost About \$6,000.00—Rev. Geo. H. Cox, D. D., Pastor.

Calvary Lutheran Mission, of Spencer, N. C., was inaugurated, and the congregation organized in 1904. Being very few in number, and having no church-home, it has been a hard struggle for the congregation to live. Rev. Geo. H. Cox, D. D., took charge of the work May 1, 1912. He was called with the hope that, out of his large and varied experience, and his intimate touch with all departments of church work, he might arouse interest and carry the work to success. At the time of his taking charge of the work the congregation was greatly depressed and discouraged because of the field having been vacant for a considerable length of time and the uncertainty of the future. Under his leadership new life has been infused, and the prospect very much brightened. New members have been received and others are making application.

A movement is now well underway for a modern stone church. The cost is to be \$6,000. The seating capacity will be about 350.

It will be of Rowan granite and will be located on Carolina Avenue near Fifth street.

Size of main auditorium is to be 40x60 feet.

Cruciform in arrangement.

Has a large Sunday School room in basement, with concrete floor.

Building furnace heated throughout.

Electric lighted in all departments.

On one side of the pulpit and chancel is to be a room for the use of parents.

On the opposite side of the chancel is to be a council chamber.

Membership when building movement began, 30.

Membership at present, 42.

The contract for the building stone has been let and is now being placed on the lot.

The contract for other material and for the erection of the building will be let as soon as the weather will permit in the spring and it is hoped that the church will be completed during the summer.

Negotiations are in progress for memorial windows, and when the whole is completed it will compare favorably with other churches of the town.

That so small a band of workers should undertake so large a task as to build a house of worship of this class is an evidence of unbounded faith and courage.

In this great undertaking the congregation has the good wishes of whole community and it is devoutly hoped the building will be completed at an early date.
