

## CHURCH FOR SPENCER LUTHERANS

Calvary Lutheran Mission Will Erect Handsome Edifice at Once-New Church Will be of Rowan Granite and Will Cost About \$6,000.00-Rev. Geo. H. Cox, D. D., Pastor.

Calvary Lutheran Mission, of Spencer, N. C., was inauguarted, and the congregation organized in 1904. Being very few in number, and having no church-home, it has been a hard struggle for the congregation to live. Rev. Geo. H. Cox, D. D., took charge of the work May 1, 1912. He was called with the hope that, out of his large and varied experience, and his infimate touch with all departments of church work, he might arouse interest and carry the work to success. At the time of his taking charge of the work the congregation as greatly depressed and discouraged because of the field having been vacant for a considerable length of time and the uncertainty of the future. Under his leadership new life has been infused, and the prospect very much brightened. New members bave been received and others are making application.

A movement is now well underway for a modern stone church. The cost is to be \$6,000. The seating capacity will be about 350. It will be of Rowan granite and
