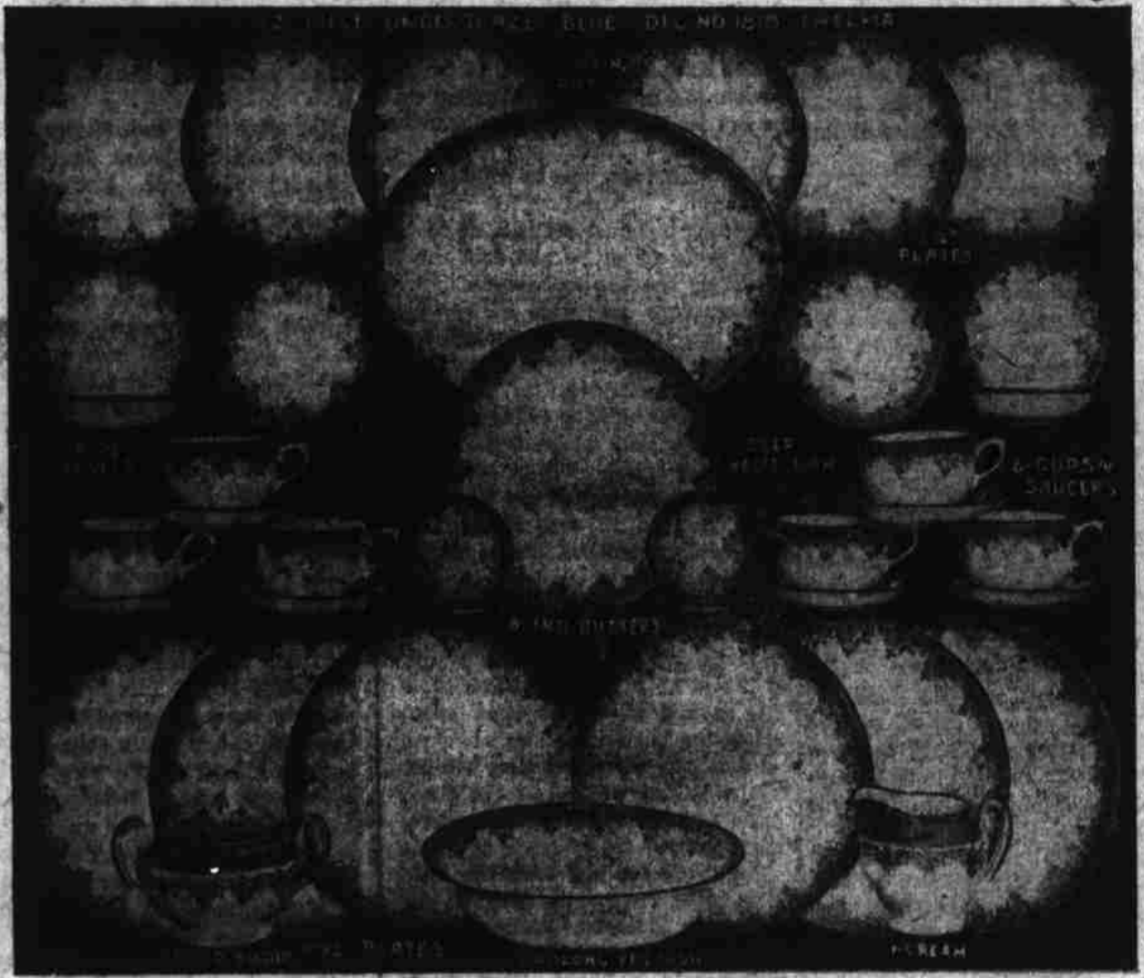
ROBBERS ARE CAPTURED.
Auto Bandits are Taken After a Flight and a Fight—Robbed a Cafe Cash Register and Flew With Police Pursuing.
New York, March 22.—Seven auto bandits were captured this morning after a running battle through the streets with the police. A hundred shots were fired though no one was hurt. The robbers held up the proprietor of a cafe and after rifling the cash register, the most of the receipts having been taken out, only twenty eight dollars were secured, the robbers fled up the avenue and were followed by the police until cornered and the arrest followed.
