

One man who refused to vote for the measure declared that he could not conscientiously assume additional obligations. When asked what amount of taxes he pays he declared with much emphasis that he pays 50 cents in Spencer and 50 cents to the poll tax. Another man who has eight children in school, which cost the 1., N. C. J. Cicero Miller. town \$10.48 each last year, pays tax on an estimated value of \$800 and worked against the measure.
