composed of six representatives to e named by the chief officers of he organizations parties hereto and six railroad officers or repreentatives selected from and by he railroad agreeing hereto. This mmission shall be constituted vithin 15 days from the signing of his agreement and shall have jurisdiction to decide all cases that may properly be referred to it on or before May 31, 1923, but not thereafter.

Compromising Controversy "6. Inasmuch as this agreement is reached for the purpose of composing in a spirit of compromise this controversy, all parties hereto agree that neither this settlement nor any decision of the commission above provided for, shall be used or cited in any controversy between these parties or between the railroads signing the same, or any other class or classes of their employes in any other controversy that may hereafter arise. "7. Both parties pledge them-

selves that no intimidation or oppression shall be practiced or permitted against any of the employes who have remained at work or have taken service or as against those who resume work under this understanding.

"8. All suits at law now pending is the result of the strike to be withdrawn and cancelled by both arties."
