SENSATIONAL ATTACK ON CORPORATION COMMISSION.

Mr. James A. Lockhart, representing the petitioners in the Ansonville depot dispute, makes a savage attack upon Corporation Commissioners McNeil and Rogers.

One of the most sensational speeches ever made in North Carolina was delivered Friday by Mr. James A. Lockhart, of this place, before the Corporation Commission at Raleigh.

The Commissioners sitting at the time were Chairman McNeil and Mr. S. L. Rogers. The hearing was on the exceptions of the petitioners to the findings of the Commissioners in locating the Southbound depot at Ansonville.

There has been a good deal of feeling about the matter and the exceedingly bitter speech made by Mr. Lockhart to some extent reflects the temper of the disputants.

"I of course realize the absolute inutilty of appearing before the members of this Commission and requesting them to overrule their own decision, especially so as this decision is one which infringes upon the rights of the people and confers almost unlimited prerogatives upon a railroad.

"The first finding by the Commission to which exception is taken is, 'The above named parties agreed in writing to submit this controversy to the Corporation Commission as arbitrators.'
