WEEKLY COTTON REVIEW.

New York, July 29.—A broadening of the speculation in the new crop months at a rather sharp advance in prices has been a prominent feature of the week in the local cotton market.

A month ago guesses on the crop yield of 13,000,000 to 13,500,000 bales were frequently heard. Now estimates of 12,000,000 maximum are common and there are those who believe that unless Texas gets the needed copious rains in the near future, the total yield is likely to be nearer 11,000,000 than 12,000,000.

The reporter of a Wall Street house after five trips of inspection over the South this season estimated the yield of 11,250,000 bales with average weather conditions during the remainder of the season.

COTTON IN COMMERCE.

Manufacturers' Record.

The South's cotton fields furnished directly or indirectly \$504,500,000 of the \$1,710,100,000 of domestic merchandise exported from this country in the fiscal year just ended.

The direct and indirect contributions of the South to the export trade of the country have, during the past few years, averaged between 38 and 40 per cent. of the total.

REMAINS OF GENERAL PACKHAM REST IN CAROLINA SOIL

From old records and newspaper clippings in her possession, Miss Minnie Massey, of this place, furnishes us the following account of the burial place of General Edward Packham, who was killed at the battle of New Orleans by General Jackson's men.

It is generally conceded that the body of General Packham was never received in England. It is claimed by some that it was mysteriously lost in some way never fully explained.
