The Council is now working to replace the juke box that was removed earlier due to the vandalism of a few people. There are many other improvements and tasks that lie ahead for the Council but they are far to numerous to mention in this article. Nothing can be accomplished though, without the continued support of the student body. During the last few troublesome weeks, a number of students have responded wonderfully and helped the council with its tasks. This goes to prove that many students have awakened to the cry for student government and are determined that it shall not fail. With this belief and sentiment shared by the entire student body, student government will not nor cannot fail. There will be but one course open, its fruitfulness and success.
