ANOTHER INDUSTRY.

A Clothing Factory to Begin Operations Next Week.

The North Durham Pants Factory is the latest industry for Durham, with a capital stock of \$50,000.

Mr. B. L. Duke has closed the contract for this industry and operations are expected to begin next week. For the present the factory will be located in the Duke building, over Summerfield's store, and about thirty or more operatives will be employed. This factory will make pants, coats, vests, suspenders and all such articles that are manufactured out of cloth. Durham is moving and Brodie Duke is helping her to move at a rapid rate.

The factory is coming, too. The machinery, we learn, has been shipped and is now on the road. The manager is expected here every day.
