Last Was the Debate With Johns Hop kins-Other News of Interest. CHAPEL HILL, March 18 - (Correspondence of the Sun.) - Messrs. D. P. Stern and R. R. Williams are spending a few days with relatives and friends in Scotland Neck, on their return from Baltimore, where they represented the University in the debate with Johns Hopkins Thursday evening of last week. The contest mentioned makes the eighth intercollegiate debate that the University has taken part in duing the last six years.
