REVENUE REPEAL ACT. The War Revenue Taxes that Were

Eleminated Tuesday. The revenue repeal act, which removes all that is left of the war tax,

goes into effect on the first day of July, the beginning of the fiscal year. On this date the internal revenue laws will return to the point at which they were at the beginning of the Spanish-American war.

At the commencement of hostilities Congress, in the endeavor to increase the revenues of the government commensurate with the increased expenses caused by the enormous outlay in conducting the war, raised the tax 50 per cent on all things already taxed, and went untaxed from the time of the removal of the same after the great civil war.

One year ago the tax on beer was reduced from \$2 per barrel, with a discount of 71 per cent, making it \$1 85 per barrel to \$1.60 per barrel, with no discount. On the first of July the tax will be \$1 per barrel.

The stamp tax on bank checks, Seven Laboratories. 22 bills of lading, express receipts, telegraph messages and warehouse receipts was repealed last year. There was left a small fraction of the stamp taxes on brokers' contracts, drafts and bills of exchange; all these are now wiped out.

Similar action has been taken in regard to cigars, which are put back substantially to the old rates. On manufactured tobacco the tax will be reduced from, 9, 6, 10 to 6 cents per pound.
