He found many of the demonstrators deeply interested in the work of cultivating their crops. They are farming as never before. There are now 50 demonstrators and 55 co-operators in the county. There is great improvement in farming in every section of the county. We are informed that the sale of the hardware dealers of Sanford in improved farm machinery, such as cultivators, harrows, etc., has been from 60 to 75 per cent greater this spring than they were last. This is significant.

Lee Superior Court.

The June term of Lee county court was held last week with Judge O. H. Allen presiding. This court was for civil cases only. As but one or two cases had been decided when The Express went to press last week the proceedings were not given. Almost the entire time of the court was devoted to the trial of railroad damage suits. Following are some of the cases tried:

Wilkins, Ricks and Company v. C. K. Rosser. This suit was brought to recover the purchase price of some patent. The plaintiffs got judgment.

Pattishall v. the Atlantic and Western Railway. This suit was brought by the plaintiff to recover damages for alleged injury while working on air breaks of defendant's train at Jonesboro in 1909. The jury gave a verdict of \$350 for Pattishall. He sued for \$4,000. Notice of appeal was given by Messrs. Oliver and Sewell, attorneys for Pattishall. The Atlantic and Western was represented by Messrs. Hayes and Hoyle.

The next and of the most important cases tried during court was that of V. M. Dorsett v. the A. C. L. Railway for ejecting him from a passenger train at Manchester, Conductor McCulloch refusing to accept mileage book as fare and demanding excess fare. Mr. Dorsett claims that he had asked for ticket at from Red Springs to Siler City when he only received one to Fayetteville, at which place he was not given time between trains to purchase a ticket. The jury rendered a verdict for \$1,250, which was reduced to \$1,000 by Judge Allen. The railroad attorneys gave notice of an appeal to the Supreme Court after a motion for a new trial was denied.

The case, McIver v. Sanford-Jonesboro Telephone Company, resulted in a mistrial. This case was brought on account of alleged injury from current on wire claimed to have been connected with central telephone office near the grove in rear of the union station where a picnic dinner was being served on the Fourth of July 1908.

Several cases against the Seaboard and Atlantic Coast Line Railways were continued for want of time. Court adjourned Friday afternoon. The next term of court will convene July 17th. It will be a two weeks' term for both criminal and civil cases, Judge Cook presiding.
