

THE STAGE IS NOW SET FOR PRIMARY VOTING SATURDAY

Contents For Several Offices Will Probably Bring Out a Big Vote in Spite of "Off" Year—Some Eleventh Hour Entrants Cause Surprise—2 Candidates for the House, Three For Sheriff—One For Recorder's Court—One For Registrar of Deeds—One For Clerk of Court, 12 For County Commissioner and Four For Constable.

Twenty-five candidates have filed notice of their candidacy with K. E. Seymour, chairman of the county board of elections of Lee County for participation in the Democratic primary next Saturday, June 7th.

For awhile it looked as if the office of county commissioner would go begging, but at the eleventh hour they became almost as numerous as the seven-year locusts.
