DEWBERRIES BRING BIG MONEY

The dewberry growers in the Vass and Cameron section have had one of the best years from point of prices that they have had in a long time. Cameron is the "Dewberry Capital." Nearly all the berries are shipped from this point. This town is the largest shipper of dewberries in the nation. Most of the berries are grown around Vass and Cameron, but a few are raised around Lemon Springs and Jonesboro in this county and Olivia across the line in Harnett county and carried to Cameron for shipment.

In addition to shipment in refrigerated railroad cars, truck load after truck load have come north on Highway No. 1, the "Main Street" of the dewberry business has estimated that U. S. A. man in close touch with the net returns to the growers in the Vass-Cameron area will total a little over a quarter million dollars.

It is said on one day 15 refrigerated box cars were shipped from Cameron full of dewberries in addition to a number of trucks carrying the berries north. The Sandhill peaches are also commanding a high price on the Northern Markets.
