THE PEACH CROP

The condition of the Sandhill peach crop, as indicated by the crop reporting service, shows an average of 66 per cent.

The Sandhill commercial peach area includes the orchads in Montgomery, Moore, Lee, Richmond, and Holes counties. The trees of bearin age total something less than 2,000-000. Of the important varieties the Hileys appears have the best prospects with a condition of 75 per cent, Georgia Belles being next with 67, per cent Elbertas 65 and Holes 59. As a rule, the orchards that have been given good care have a good outlook for priduction. Bacteriosis and winter killings have been as conspicuous as usual. Curclio has also given less trouble this year.

Dry weather to June has enabled the growers to use control methods very effectively. While many trees do not have heavy crops, they are rather well distributed which will probably result in rather good sized and quality fruit. This indicates that a large percentage of the crop will be of saleable quantity.

While probably 80 per cent of the orchards have been taken care of, the remaining 20 per cent which are either abandoned or neglected are calculated to produce fruit which will hurt the reputation of the high-class product. This will practically be ture, if it is sold as "Sandhill peaches."

The present total peach production in North Carolina is indicated at 1,428,000 bushels, reckoned on a condition of 42 per cent, including commercial prospects. The condition a year ago, was 68 per cent. and the ten-year average is 60 per cent. The unfavorable spring weather is probably responsible for the shortage of fruit.

According to many growers in the Sandhill area, the carlot movement is expected to be anywhere from 1500 to 1900 cars. Additional production will move by motor truck.
