NEW PECAN VARIETY GROWN IN EDGECOMBE.

The Bake pecan, the first nut of any kind to receive a patent under the plant patent laws of Congress, may mark the beginning of a new era in pecan growing along northern limit of the area adopted to the commecial culture of this tree crop.

W. H. Brake, of Rocky Mount, has the original tree of this new pecan in his front yard—it is one of five trees resulting from nuts planted 23 years ago by his father, H. L. Brake.

The nuts planted were secured from the famous Williamson tree at Raligh noted for its large sige, magnificent beauty and enormous crops of thin-
