"When we consider that there are in America 3,500,000 persons whose chances in life have either been han dicapped or absolutely ruined by their attempts to defeat the law, we begin to understand what crime real ly costs When we realize that these 3,500,000 persons annually roll up a total of 1,500,000 serious crimes each one of which affects the victim in some moral, mental, or physical manner, we are shocked even more Beyond that, we must consider the social and financial wreckage brought upon an entire family when one of its members are sent to prison"
