## NC GALA CLE Features D'Emilio

Nationally acclaimed speaker's book quoted in Lawrence v. Texas decision

North Carolina Gay and Lesbian Attorneys' 2006 Continuing Legal Education seminar will be held Friday March 17 at 3pm at the Durham Arts Council. Featured speaker will be historian John D'Emilio of the University of Chicago. D'Emilio's presentation, "Will the Courts Give Us Equality? Reflections on Lawrence and the Same Sex Marriage Effort", will be followed by a panel discussion, "A North Carolina Perspective on Options for Equality" featuring North Carolina attorneys, public officials, and legal scholars. The seminar will offer two CLE credits and is offered free to members of NC GALA.

John D'Emilio is a historian and activist. He teaches at the University of Illinois at Chicago where he has helped

D'Emilio is the author or editor of more than half a dozen books including *Sexual Politics, Sexual Communities*, a pioneering history of the pre-Stonewall "homophile movement"; *Intimate Matters: A History of*
