Nationally acclaimed speaker's book quoted in Lawrence v. Texas decision

Featured speaker will be historian John D'Emilio of the University of Chicago. D'Emilio's presentation, "Will the Courts Give Us Equality? Reflections on Lawrence and the Same Sex Marriage Effort", will be followed by a panel discussion, "A North Carolina Perspective on Options for Equality" featuring North Carolina attorneys, public officials, and legal scholars. The seminar will offer two CLE credits and is offered free to members of NC GALA.
