

# Brief Review Of State, National And World News During The Past Week

## GERMAN AMBASSADOR IS BOMBED ON DEPARTURE

Buenos Aires, Argentina — A crowd of Argentine anti-Nazis set off two small bombs near the residence of the German ambassador early Saturday morning, a few hours before the envoy, Edmund von Thermann, escorted his much-discussed guest, Captain Fritz Wiedemann, to a boat en route to a new consular post in the Far East.

Von Thermann, whose expulsion has been demanded by Argentine congressmen, laughingly described the demonstration as "a farewell to Captain Wiedemann by our old friends the (anti-Nazi) Action Argentina." Both he and Wiedemann said the bombs didn't disturb their slumber.

Police reserves dispersed about twenty men in the demonstrating group and arrested one. Nobody was hurt and the damage was trivial.

A small fire bomb exploded about 130 yards from the house and stones rattled against the wall during the disturbance.

## N. C. LAUNCHES FIRST WARSHIP SINCE WAR

Elizabeth City.—The first combat vessel to be launched in North Carolina since the World War slid down the Marine railway into the Pasquotank River Saturday at christening ceremonies.

It was one of eight submarine chasers to be built at the Elizabeth City shipyard. Rear Admiral Felix Gyax commended the work of the shipyard and said he believed it would continue its accelerated rate of construction. Seven other 110-foot sub chasers will be launched at 30-day intervals.

## LINDBERGH IS RAPPED BY SOCIALIST PARTY

Boston.—The Socialist party said that Charles A. Lindbergh's reference to Jews as a group pressing this country toward war was "at once a serious blow to democracy and to the movement to keep the United States out of war."

In a statement at the conclusion of a three-day meeting, the party's national executive committee said "although it is true that Lindbergh recognized and condemned Nazi cruelty to the Jews, that fact can not undo the harm done by his other statements."

Asserting "no one nationality, race or people is responsible" for this war, the committee said its origins "cut across all such lines; they have their roots, instead, in an economic system."

## SONS OF AMERICA TO MEET IN BALTIMORE

Statesville.—The national convention of the Patriotic Order Sons of America will be held at the Belvedere Hotel, in Baltimore, Md., on September 23 and 24, according to an announcement by National President Hugh G. Mitchell.

The program for the convention includes a banquet to be held Tuesday night at which Congressman Robert L. Doughton and U. S. Senator George L. Radcliffe, of Maryland, have been invited to speak. Other speakers who have been invited to address the delegates during the convention include Colonel F. H. Kohlas of the U. S. War Department and Mayor Howard Jackson of Baltimore.

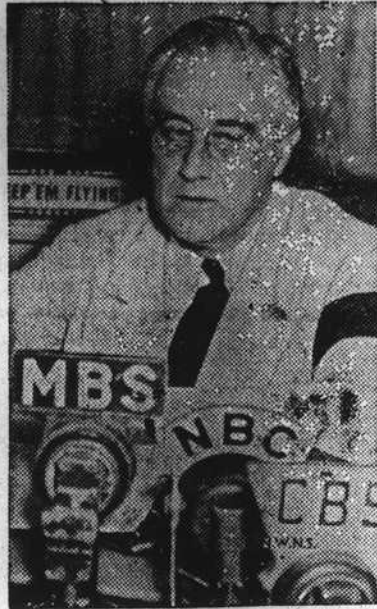
## POLIO EPIDEMIC IS NOW ON DECREASE

Health officials in the Southeast report that cooler weather, plus precautionary measures, has resulted in a drop in the number of infantile paralysis cases which have been particularly widespread in Georgia, Eastern Tennessee and Alabama.

Since June 1 more than 1,300 cases of polio have been reported in Georgia and Alabama while the disease in Tennessee has centered in the Chattanooga area where there have been 96 cases since July 1.

School and college openings were postponed, public swimming pools closed and children generally warned to keep out of crowds in cities and counties where the cases neared epidemic proportions. Most of the bans have now been lifted but strict precautions continue in Chattanooga, where civic meetings were called off, theatres closed and children told to keep off the streets during the height of the outbreak in August.

## Big Mock Air Battle Will Be Fought Over WNC Mountains

### HUX IS CHOSEN PRES. OF YOUNG N. C. DEMOCRATS

Winston-Salem.—In a wrangling fight unprecedented in the annals of the Young Democratic clubs of North Carolina, A. Leonidas Hux, of Halifax county, was elected president of the organization.

After the presidential battle, harmony ruled and the whole Hux slate of other officers went in without opposition.

They are: Henrietta Price, of Asheville, vice-president; Dr. J. R. Saunders, Morganton, treasurer; Patsy Davenport, Greenville, national committeewoman; Charles F. Gold, of Rutherfordton, national committeeman; and Ralph Monger Jr., of Sanford, secretary. All except Hux were installed at the meeting.

Because it takes two pounds more of crude rubber to make a white sidewall tire than it does to make a regular black one, U. S. manufacturers will suspend production of sidewalls for the present.

Tampa, Fla.—A great mock air battle will be "fought" by the U. S. army air corps over the mountainous terrain of North and South Carolina next month, Brig. Gen. Walter H. Frank, commander of the third interceptor command announced here. The maneuvers begin October 20.

Plans for the big aerial maneuvers, in which more than 500 planes of all types are scheduled to take part, are now being mapped by interceptor command headquarters at Drew field here, General Frank said.

The command, and its civilian aircraft warning service, are now engaged in combat rehearsal in the Texas-Louisiana maneuvers, are scheduled to transfer from there to the Carolinas upon completion of present operations.

Bases from which pursuit interceptor planes will operate in the Carolinas are being kept secret by the command, but General Frank reported that A. W. S. (aircraft warning service) command posts for the opposing forces are to be established at Charleston, S. C., and Wilmington, N. C.

Filter centers, to which an esti-

mated 10,000 civilian "spotters" will report the movement of "enemy" aircraft, will be set up at Savannah, Ga., Columbus, S. C., and Charlotte and Raleigh, N. C., General Frank said.

Messages received from the civilian observers will be checked and evaluated at the filter centers and the information relayed to the command posts. Operation of interceptor units will be directed by radio from the command posts.

Planes to be used in the maneuvers are mostly pursuit and

pursuit-interceptors, but bombers will be used as "enemy raiders," to be fought off by the defense forces.

The big engagement will go on for five days without letup, with the entire strength of the third interceptor command participating, General Frank said.

Personnel of the command are scheduled to begin moving into the Carolinas area the first week in October.
