

# Sixteen Seniors Get Diplomas At Glade Valley

## 1943 Graduating Class Is Larger Than Usual Here

### Presbyterian School Was Founded In The County In 1911

Glade Valley school, which is the only private school in the county, has 18 in the graduating class this year.

This is a Presbyterian school which was established in 1911 and attracts students from out of the county as well as some from other states. The faculty is well trained and is headed by Superintendent E. B. Eldridge, a graduate of State College, who has been in charge since 1917.

## CHARLES M. SCHWAB DIED WITHOUT MONEY

New York — Charles M. Schwab, who once turned down an offer of \$50,000,000 for a half interest in the Bethlehem Steel company, actually was broke when he died, an estate tax appraisal disclosed.

The appraisal schedules listed assets of \$1,389,509, against obligations of 1,727,858, of which \$1,670,815 were debts.

Schwab, whose name and the word "steel" were almost synonymous for decades, started his career as a grocery boy in Braddock, Pa., and climbed up the rungs of the steel industry until his fortune was estimated as high as \$450,000,000. During his lifetime he contributed to charitable and educational organizations.

It was luck, Schwab once told an interviewer, that made him at 39 the man Andrew Carnegie and J. P. Morgan the elder selected as first president of the merger called U. S. Steel. Later, it was reported he turned down an offer of \$1,000,000-a-year from Krupp's in Germany to stay on where he was at \$100,000 a year.
