The allied forces continue to pound the Axis from the air this week while Europe has quivered under a severe case of invasion jitters

Great fleets of British bombers battered the Rhineland industrial city of Cologne and the U-boat center of Hamburg yesterday to hit a new high in the devastation heaped upon Germany's war machine in a single month although June still has two nights to go. Observers said the raid on Cologne was comparable with the previous heaviest attack on the Ruhr in which more than 2,000 tons of bombs were dropped. Gen. Draja Mikhailovitch's Ju-


