Sparta Girls Win **Over Piney Creek** 



## **Rex Viers Killed** While In Service

Fall From Troop Train In Ala. Is Fatal To Transou Man.

Hale Truitt, one of the first Alleghany county boys to be taken prisoner by the enemy, is now at Stalag IIIB, a German prison camp southeast of Berlin where the largest group of cap-tured Americans has been in-terned, it was learned recently. In a recent letter, Hale writes that he is in good health and has received some mail and packages. Funeral service was held at Peak Creek Presbyterian church on Saturday for Rex Viers, 21, Transou soldier, who was acci-dentally killed in Ala. on October agencies of National War Fund representing our Allies use part of their funds to provide pack-ages for war prisoners. "Stalag IIIB is very big and located in a pine forest according to a report received by the Na-tional War Fund. The prison camp consists of huts and is like a little town, with long, straight concrete streets. Between the huts are so many open spaces that air and sunshine can reach all of them.
